

You Shall Not Commit Adultery.

Overview

The Commandment, *You shall not commit adultery* has different levels of meaning. Here are some of the things that are meant by adultery:

- Committing adultery; unlawful joining of bodies (unlawful by God's standards of behavior)
- Turning away from marriage, or turning others away from it
- Obscene actions, desires, or will
- Entertaining filthy thoughts
- Filthy words
- Lust
 - Looking at another person to lust for her or him
- Being unmerciful
- Savagery
- Cruelty
- Denying the holiness of the Word
- Profaning the Word
 - Adulterating what is good
 - Falsifying what is true
- Being unfaithful to what is good and true
- Ridiculing in heart the good and true things of church and religion
- Denying the divinity of the Lord
- Claiming divine power for yourself

Here are some other things that may be meant by adultery:

- Slothfulness, laziness, procrastination
- Foolishness

General: [In general] to commit adultery means to...

1. Upset the laws of order.¹

Earthly (literal) sense: In the “external” sense to commit adultery means to...

1. Commit adulteries.²
2. Be unlawfully conjoined as to the body.³
3. Ask counsel of the delight of some lust.⁴

Internal representative sense: In the “internal representative” sense to commit adultery means...

1. To worship idols and other gods...⁵
 - a. By means of such things as are of the church,⁶
2. Thus idolatry, external and internal.⁷

Spiritual sense: In the spiritual sense committing adultery has to do with...

1. **Good and truth:** To commit adultery means to...
 - a. Adulterate good and pervert truth.⁸
 - 1) Note: The consequence of this is that falsities are acknowledged.⁹
 - b. Adulterate good and falsify truth.¹⁰
 - c. Pervert good and falsify truth.¹¹
 - d. Pervert the goods and falsify the truths that are of the doctrine of faith and of charity,¹²
 - 1) Thus to adulterate goods and falsify truths.¹³
 - e. Pervert the goods and truths of the church.¹⁴
 - f. Pervert goods and truths...¹⁵
 - 1) So that goods become evils and truths become falsities.¹⁶
 - g. Falsify and pervert good and truth.¹⁷
2. **Truth and good:** To commit adultery means to...
 - a. Pervert truth.¹⁸
 - b. Falsify truths and adulterate goods.¹⁹
 - 1) [In this way to] go a whoring after strange gods.²⁰
 - c. Falsify and pervert the truths and goods of faith and charity.²¹
 - d. Sacrifice (pervert) truths and goods.²²
 - e. Pervert truths and goods by means of [known] facts.²³
 - 1) Note: [This is to] commit whoredom with [known] facts.²⁴
 - f. Pervert the truths of faith and adulterate the goods of faith through reasoning [based on known] facts,²⁵

- 1) And yet [being insatiable in this].²⁶
- g. Multiply this kind of whoredom [that is, perverting the truths of faith and adulterating the goods of faith] even to the profanation of truth,...²⁷
 - 1) And yet [being insatiable in this].²⁸
- h. Pervert the truths and goods of the church...even to profanation.²⁹
- i. Pervert the truth and good of the Word.³⁰
 - 1) Note: Perversion of the truth and good of the Word [happens when the Word is applied to confirm falsities and evils.]³¹
- j. [Have] falsity in the place of truth and evil in the place of good.³²
- 3. **Falsity:** To commit adultery means to...
 - a. Acknowledge falsities.³³
 - b. [Be] in falsities, that is, in truths perverted.³⁴
 - c. [Be in] falsity from the perversion of truth.³⁵
 - 1) In the Scriptures, falsity from the perversion of truth is meant by the "wine of [Babylon's] whoredom".³⁶
 - d. Vaunt falsity of doctrine as truth.³⁷
 - e. [Be in] falsity of evil.³⁸
 - 1) In the Scriptures, falsity of evil is meant by the "wine" of [Babylon's] whoredom.³⁹
 - f. Worship falsity.⁴⁰
- 4. **Applying and explaining the Word:** To commit adultery means to...
 - a. Confirm falsity and evil by wrong applications from the Word.⁴¹
 - b. Apply the Word to confirm evils and falsities.⁴²
 - c. Apply the doctrine of faith and charity to confirm evils and falsities.⁴³
 - d. [Be] led into errors through false reasoning and wrong interpretations of the Word.⁴⁴
 - 1) In the Scriptures, this is what is meant by being "made drunk" with the wine of [Babylon's] whoredom.⁴⁵
 - e. Explain and pervert the truths of the Word...⁴⁶
 - 1) From your own heart,⁴⁷
 - a) That is, from your own [self],⁴⁸
 - 2) In such a manner as the loves of self and the world persuade you to do,⁴⁹
 - 3) Consequently to speak lies, that is, falsities.⁵⁰
 - f. [Listen] to answers that come from the imaginary power of your own intellect.⁵¹
 - g. Make appearances and likenesses of truth out of matters of knowledge of good and truth.⁵²
 - 1) Commit whoredom with these appearances and likenesses.⁵³
 - 2) [Scripture: a Scriptural verse that is referenced speaks of the following:]⁵⁴
 - a) Taking the vessels of your adornment of My gold and of My silver which I had given you,
 - b) Making for yourself images of a male [from them],
 - c) And committing whoredom with them.
 - 3) Pervert (profane) the truths of faith and adulterate the goods of faith...⁵⁵
 - a) Through reasoning by means of known facts.
 - 4) Commit whoredom with reasoning...⁵⁶
 - a) Even to the profanation of truth.⁵⁷

- 5) Commit whoredom with known facts...⁵⁸
 - a) Even to the profanation of truth.⁵⁹
- 5. **The loves of self and the world:** To commit adultery means to...
 - a. Sacrifice to the love of self.⁶⁰
 - b. Burn incense to the love of the world.⁶¹
 - c. Pervert the truths and goods of the church for the sake of self-dominion and self-gain, even to profanation.⁶²
 - d. Be led into errors and ravings through the falsities of evil,⁶³
 - 1) [Specifically, the evils of] self-dominion and self-gain, [that is, the love of self and love of the world].⁶⁴
 - 2) In the Scriptures, this is what is meant by being "made drunk with the wine of [Babylon's] whoredom".⁶⁵
- 6. **Refusal to receive anything of faith and charity:**
 - a. Note: Anyone who commits adultery on earth and takes delight in it refuses any longer to receive from heaven anything of faith and charity. [Editorial note: The words, "refuses any longer" mean so long as the person continues in adultery and its delight.⁶⁶]

Words and phrases from Scripture: In the Sacred Scriptures, to commit adultery means to...

1. Commit whoredom.⁶⁷
2. Pour out your whoredoms on everyone that [passes] by.⁶⁸
3. Take of your garments and make for yourself high places of various colors, and commit whoredom upon them.⁶⁹
4. Take the vessels of your adornment of [the Lord's] gold and silver, which He [has] given you, [make] for yourself images of a male, [and] commit whoredom with them.⁷⁰
5. Take your sons and your daughters whom you have born to [the Lord] and sacrifice them.⁷¹
6. Commit whoredom with the sons of Egypt your neighbors, great of flesh.⁷²
7. Multiply your whoredom to provoke [the Lord].⁷³
8. Commit whoredom with the sons of Ashur, when you were insatiable, and yet not [being] sated.⁷⁴
9. Multiply your whoredom, even to the land of traffic, to Chaldea, and yet in this not being sated.⁷⁵
10. Take strangers.⁷⁶
11. Give hire to all your lovers, and recompense them, that they may come to you from every side for your whoredoms.⁷⁷
12. Be an [adulterer]/ adulteress and a shedder of blood.⁷⁸
13. Delight yourself against [the Lord].⁷⁹
14. Make the mouth wide and thrust out the tongue at [the Lord].⁸⁰
15. Transgress.⁸¹
16. Backslide.⁸²
17. Forget the Lord and trust in a lie.⁸³
18. Practice hypocrisy.⁸⁴
19. Commit adultery and walk in a lie.⁸⁵
 - a. Horrible stubbornness in doing these things⁸⁶
20. Strengthen the hands of the evil.⁸⁷
21. Speak a vision of the heart, not out of the mouth of Jehovah.⁸⁸

22. Commit debauchery with the wives of [your] companions.⁸⁹
23. Speak a word in the Lord's name falsely, which He [has] not commanded.⁹⁰

Additional information:

1. **On the origin of adulteries:**
 - a. Adulteries correspond to the marriage of falsity and evil.⁹¹
2. **On the origin of the love of adultery:**
 - a. The love of adultery comes from the marriage of falsity and evil, thus from hell, that is, from the devil.⁹²

"Adultery" includes the following:

1. Making a man's seed, in which there lies hidden the inmost of his life, and thus the rudiment of a new life, common with the inmosts and rudiments of others.⁹³
2. All whoredom that destroys married love, also the [inclination to marry and preference of marriage], by turning [people's] minds away from marriage to adultery:⁹⁴
 - a. Whoredom of a husband with the wife of another...⁹⁵
 - 1) When done from loathing or aversion to marriage.⁹⁶
 - b. The delight of violating wives.⁹⁷
 - c. Whoredom of a husband with any woman, whether a widow, virgin, or harlot...⁹⁸
 - 1) When done from loathing or aversion to marriage.⁹⁹
 - d. Whoredom of a wife with a married man or with a single man...¹⁰⁰
 - 1) When done from loathing or aversion to marriage.¹⁰¹
 - e. Whoredoms of any unmarried man with the wife of another or of any unmarried woman with the husband of another.¹⁰²
 - f. The delight of varieties although with harlots.¹⁰³
 - 1) The delight of varieties and changes of harlots.¹⁰⁴
 - 2) Note: The delight of variety destroys the delight of marriage.¹⁰⁵
 - g. The delight of deflowering virgins without the end of marriage.¹⁰⁶
 - 1) Note: Those who are in this delight afterwards desire marriage only for the sake of defloration, and when that is accomplished they loathe marriage.¹⁰⁷
 - h. The delight of debauching virgins.¹⁰⁸
 - i. Note (by Swedenborg): That which does not destroy the inclination to marry and does not extinguish its love is fornication springing from a certain instinct of nature towards marriage, which for various reasons cannot yet be entered into.¹⁰⁹
3. Believing adulteries to be allowable and perceiving them to be more delightful than marriages.¹¹⁰
4. Having delight in adulteries and having no delight in marriages.¹¹¹
5. Confirming yourself in adulteries and committing them from favor and consent of the will.¹¹²
6. Cherishing filthy thoughts respecting such things as pertain to marriage.¹¹³
7. [Cherishing] unchaste and filthy thoughts.¹¹⁴
8. Thinking from any intention about an additional wife or woman.¹¹⁵
 - a. This is [to turn] heaven into hell.¹¹⁶
 - b. If an angel merely thinks of such a thing he or she falls from heaven.¹¹⁷

9. Hell and the rejection of all [good and true] things of the church.¹¹⁸
 - a. These things are meant in the spiritual sense of the Word by adulteries and whoredoms.¹¹⁹
 - b. Adultery is hell with a person.¹²⁰
 - c. Adultery is hell, and consequently an abomination.¹²¹
 - d. Adulteries are more and less infernal and abominable.¹²²
 - e. Hell is called adultery.¹²³
10. Adulterating good and (consequently) falsifying truth.¹²⁴
 - a. Adulterations of good are in themselves evils.¹²⁵
 - b. Falsifications of truth are in themselves falsities.¹²⁶
 - c. Adulterations of good and falsifications of truth are meant in the Word by "adulteries and whoredoms".¹²⁷
11. Separating truth from good.¹²⁸
 - a. Truth [that is separated from good] is not truth but falsity, when regarded interiorly.¹²⁹
12. Separating good from truth.¹³⁰
 - a. Good [that is separated from truth] is not good but evil, when regarded interiorly.¹³¹
13. Separating faith from good works both in doctrine and in life.¹³²
14. Believing that sins are remitted by the Holy Supper and not by repentance of life.¹³³
15. Studying the Word only for the sake of glory.¹³⁴
16. Teaching falsely and living wickedly.¹³⁵
 - a. Priests who have done this have adulterated and falsified the Word.¹³⁶
 - 1) Even though [such priests may not be] adulterers, adultery is excited by them.¹³⁷
 - 2) Such adultery is called sacerdotal adultery, which is distinguishable from other adulteries.¹³⁸
17. Living in the marriage of evil and falsity...¹³⁹
 - a. By thinking evils and falsities from a delight in them,¹⁴⁰
 - b. And by doing evils and falsities from a love for them.¹⁴¹
18. Being in evils from a love of ruling over others from mere delight in ruling and in no delight of use.¹⁴²
19. Blaspheming the holy things that are in the Word from the heart.¹⁴³
20. Altogether denying the Divine.¹⁴⁴
 - a. Denying God in heart.¹⁴⁵

Effects of adultery/the love of adultery: An adulterer...

1. Turns away from marriage.¹⁴⁶
2. Removes him- or herself from heaven...¹⁴⁷
 - a. So far as he or she loves adultery.¹⁴⁸
3. Closes (shuts up) heaven and opens hell to him- or herself...¹⁴⁹
 - a. So far as adulteries are believed to be allowable and perceived to be more delightful than marriages.¹⁵⁰
4. Does not receive the least influx from heaven.¹⁵¹
5. [Has a hard] heart.¹⁵²
6. Ceases to believe anything of the church or of the Word.¹⁵³
 - a. Believes nothing of the Word, thus nothing of the church.¹⁵⁴
 - b. Makes no account of divine truths and thus of the Word.¹⁵⁵

7. Is in no marriage from a spiritual origin, which is of good and truth, but only a marriage from a natural origin.¹⁵⁶
8. Is in no union of minds, but only a union of bodies from a lascivious disposition (lust) in the flesh.¹⁵⁷
 - a. Marriage [with him or her] is not spiritual but carnal.¹⁵⁸
9. Is in every evil love, if not in act yet in endeavor...¹⁵⁹
 - a. To the extent that he or she is in the love of adultery.
10. Is merely natural.¹⁶⁰
 - a. The lasciviousness of adultery makes one with naturalism.¹⁶¹
11. Becomes a wholly sensual person, and after death an infernal spirit.¹⁶²
12. [Becomes increasingly unhappy.]
 - a. All that is undelightful and unhappy in the marriages in which the love of adultery reigns increases in direfulness even to the lowest hell.¹⁶³
13. Becomes a form of hell.¹⁶⁴
14. Becomes an image of the devil.¹⁶⁵
15. Is desperately unmerciful, savage, and cruel.¹⁶⁶

Spiritual adultery defined and related to natural adulteries and to the love of adultery:

1. Spiritual adultery is the love of evil and falsity.¹⁶⁷
 - a. The love of evil and falsity is the spiritual element within the natural love of adultery as a cause is in its effect.¹⁶⁸
2. Spiritual adultery is the conjunction of evil and falsity.¹⁶⁹
3. Natural adultery exists according to correspondence from the love and consequent conjunction of evil and falsity.¹⁷⁰
4. Adulteries correspond to adulterations of good and consequent falsifications of truth.¹⁷¹
 - a. Note: adulterations of good are in themselves evils, and falsifications of truth are in themselves falsities.¹⁷²
5. Adulteries correspond to defilements of good and truth.¹⁷³

The origin of adultery:

1. The marriage of evil and falsity¹⁷⁴
2. The love and consequent conjunction of evil and falsity¹⁷⁵

The origin of any aura or atmosphere of adultery:

1. Any conjunction of evil and falsity in the spiritual world¹⁷⁶

The origin of the love of adultery:

1. The origin of the love of adultery is the marriage of evil and falsity, which in its essence is hell.¹⁷⁷
2. The love of evil and falsity¹⁷⁸
 - a. Note: The love of evil and falsity is the spiritual element within the natural love of adultery as a cause is in its effect.¹⁷⁹
 - b. The doctrine of falsity and evil is the origin from which a desire and favor for adultery from hell flow in.¹⁸⁰
 - 1) Note: Interiorly regarded, falsity is truth separated from good, and evil is good separated from truth.¹⁸¹

The love of adultery defined:

1. The love of evil and falsity¹⁸²
2. The love of evil for falsity and of falsity for evil¹⁸³
3. The love of bearing fruit, namely, evil through falsity and falsity from evil¹⁸⁴

The love of adultery defined as to its acts:

1. The love of adultery in its acts is impurity itself and unchasteness itself.¹⁸⁵
 - a. Note: Unchasteness comes up from beneath.¹⁸⁶

The love of adultery described:

1. Within it is deadly hatred.¹⁸⁷
2. It is a fire enkindled from impurities that soon burns out and is turned into cold, and into an aversion corresponding to hatred.¹⁸⁸
3. It is the fundamental love of all infernal loves.¹⁸⁹
 - a. Note: Infernal loves are in themselves not loves but hatreds.¹⁹⁰
4. [It causes unhappiness.]
 - a. Note: All that is undelightful and unhappy in the marriages in which the love of adultery reigns increases in direfulness even to the lowest hell.¹⁹¹

The delights of the love of adultery--where they derive from:

1. They derive from the delights of doing evil uses, thus of evil doing.¹⁹²

The delight of adultery described and defined:

1. It is an infernal delight.¹⁹³
2. It counterfeits the delight of the love of good.¹⁹⁴
3. There is nothing but what is impure, unchaste, and lascivious within it.¹⁹⁵
4. In itself it is the delight of the love of evil.¹⁹⁶
5. In its essence it is the delight of hatred against good and truth.¹⁹⁷
6. It is the delight of hatred and thus [the delight] of doing evil.¹⁹⁸
7. This [delight] is with those who are in hell.¹⁹⁹
 - a. To do evil is the joy of their heart.²⁰⁰
 - 1) This they call their heaven.²⁰¹
 - b. Their delight in doing evil derives its all from hatred and vindictiveness against good and truth.²⁰²
 - c. When they are moved by a deadly and diabolical hatred they rage against heaven, especially against those who are from heaven and who worship the Lord.²⁰³
 - d. They violently burn to slaughter them.²⁰⁴
 - e. They will to destroy their souls.²⁰⁵
8. It is the delight of hatred which, becoming a fire in the extremes and being injected into the lusting flesh, becomes for the moment the delight of adultery.²⁰⁶
 - a. [At that moment] the soul in which the hatred lies concealed withdraws itself.²⁰⁷
9. For this reason adulterers are desperately unmerciful, savage, and cruel.²⁰⁸
10. Note: This is the infernal marriage.²⁰⁹

The nature of love between an adulterer and an adulteress:

1. There is no love between an adulterer and an adulteress except such as the love of hatred is.²¹⁰
 - a. They can be in conjunction in externals but not in internals.²¹¹
 - 1) Adultery is fiery in the externals but cold in the internals.²¹²
 - b. The man feels impotence if the woman desires the act, and still more if she importunes it.²¹³ ["Importune" means to request repeatedly, urge, insist upon, demand.]
 - 1) The internal which is cold then comes into effort and flows into what is fiery in the externals and extinguishes it, and so casts it off as unfit.²¹⁴
 - 2) The lust of violating, which also enkindles that impure fire, then perishes.²¹⁵
2. The love of adultery is a fire enkindled from impurities that soon burns out and is turned into cold, and into an aversion corresponding to hatred.²¹⁶

Things that come forth from adulteries and from the love of adultery:

1. Infernal and diabolical loves²¹⁷
2. Hatreds of every kind²¹⁸
 - a. From the love of adultery hatreds of every kind gush forth...²¹⁹
 - 1) Against God.²²⁰
 - 2) Against the neighbor.²²¹
 - 3) Against every good and truth of heaven and the church.²²²
3. All evil [and all falsity]²²³
 - a. [The love of adultery] is the love of evil for falsity and of falsity for evil, and from this source a person has all evil.²²⁴
 - b. From the marriage of evil and falsity by love there exists the love of bearing fruit, namely, evil through falsity and falsity from evil.²²⁵
4. Insanities and follies²²⁶
5. Deceit and no peace²²⁷
6. The very Asmodean demons and the hells that those have who live in adulteries²²⁸
7. All infelicities²²⁹
 - a. All infelicities belong to the love of adultery.²³⁰
8. Foulnesses of every kind²³¹
9. Filth²³²
 - a. Filth itself²³³
10. Deformity, which is monstrous according to [an adulterer's] quality²³⁴
11. Extreme impotence (the final lot of those who are in adulteries) from which the adulterer...²³⁵
 - a. Becomes emptied of all the fire and light of life²³⁶
 - b. Dwells alone in deserts as an image of the slothfulness and weariness of his or her own life²³⁷

An adulterer's justifications for adultery:

1. After a person has closed heaven to him- or herself [by loving adultery, etc.,] he afterwards reasons [as follows, or in some similar way]:²³⁸
 - a. "Marriage and adulteries are alike, but marriages must be maintained in kingdoms for the sake of order and on account of the education of offspring."²³⁹
 - b. "Adulteries are not criminal, since offspring are equally born from them."²⁴⁰

- c. "Adulteries are not harmful to women, since they can endure them."²⁴¹
- d. "[Adulteries are not harmful, since] by them the procreation of the human race is promoted."²⁴²
- e. Note: The adulterer/ adulteress does not know that these and other like reasonings in favor of adulteries ascend from the Stygian waters of hell, and that the lustful and bestial nature of humankind which inheres in him or her from birth attracts them and sucks them in with delight, as a swine does excrement.²⁴³

 - b. Committing whoredom and speaking the Lord's Word falsely.²⁶¹
 - c. Committing whoredom because of leaving Jehovah.²⁶²
 - d. Turning to them that have familiar spirits and to the wizards, to go a whoring after them.²⁶³
 - e. Going a whoring after the gods of the inhabitants of the land.²⁶⁴
 - f. Being given to drink of the wine of the anger of Babylon's fornication.²⁶⁵
 - g. Committing whoredom with the great harlot.²⁶⁶

Heavenly sense: In the heavenly sense to commit adultery means to...²⁶⁷

1. Deny the holiness of the Word and profane it.
 - a. The holiness of the Word is denied and profaned by those who in heart ridicule all [good and true] things of the church and of religion.

Characteristics of an adulterer:

1. A person who abstains from adulteries and whoredoms solely on account of certain kinds of fear, or on account of any natural or moral law, and not at the same time on account of spiritual law, is nevertheless inwardly an adulterer and fornicator. Such a person...²⁶⁸
 - a. Believes that adulteries and whoredoms are not sins.
 - b. Does not in spirit make them unlawful before God.
 - c. Commits them in spirit, even if he or she does not commit them in the body before the world.
 - d. [In spirit] speaks openly in favor of them.

Comparisons: Adulterers may be compared to...²⁶⁹

1. Covenant-breakers who violate compacts.
2. The satyrs and priapi of the ancients who roamed in forests, crying out, "Where are there virgins, betrothed maidens, and wives to sport with?"²⁷⁰
3. Rank he goats, or dogs that run about the streets, looking about and smelling for female dogs to satiate their lasciviousness.
4. "...And so on."²⁷¹
